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## A Letter from Bishop Christopher

Dear Friends,

'We are convinced that England will never be converted until the laity use the opportunities for evangelism daily offered by their various professions, crafts and occupations... this being so, the Christian laity should be recognised as the priesthood of the Church in the working world, and as the Church militant in action in the mission fields of politics, industry and commerce'. So said the 1946 report, Towards the Conversion of England, commissioned by Archbishop William Temple.



Seventy years later, and a more recent report, *Setting God's People Free*, debated at General Synod earlier this year, makes exactly the same point, and asks for what it calls two major culture changes in the way we think about being and doing Church.

'Until, together, we find a way to form and equip lay people to follow Jesus confidently in <u>every</u> sphere of life in ways that demonstrate the Gospel we will never set God's people free to evangelise the nation,' says the report. 'Until laity and clergy are convinced, based on their baptismal mutuality, that they are equal in worth and status, complementary in gifting and vocation, mutually accountable in discipleship and equal partners in mission, we will never form communities that can evangelise the nation'.

It is a report that reminds us that as Christians we are not just redeemed *'from'* something, but *'for'* something as well. Each one of us is called to play our part in bringing about the transformation of our world and of lives as we share what we know of Jesus in all the different places God sends us to. We gather together on a Sunday to be sent scattered into the world as Church the other six days of the week.

It is an exciting vision of what the Church has always been called to be, but maybe one we have not always lived out. The challenge for us as a diocese is how we do that now, to move from just words in a report, to actions that make a difference. Seventy years has been a long time to wait!

## Thy Kingdom Come - Thought for the Season - Rosamund Seal

Like everyone reading this I have been shocked and temporarily numbed by news of the recent terrorist attacks in Manchester and London followed by the, even more horrifying, fire in Grenfell Tower.

But I have also been astonishingly encouraged and moved by the responses of those who were present and those who were involved.



The London attack took place on the eve of Pentecost -

the day when the first disciples received the gifts of the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire. The Spirit which gave them the courage and confidence to share the good news of Christ throughout the world. The Fruits of the Spirit we are told in Galatians, are Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-control.

And just look at how many of those fruits we have seen in action. Yes there have been many voices on Facebook and elsewhere screaming hatred and baying for blood in response to the terrorist attacks but on the ground, amongst those who were **there**, those who live and work in those communities, and in particular among those who have been so tragically bereaved, there have been extraordinary acts of bravery, compassion, a generosity to strangers and, most strikingly, a point blank refusal to hate and to stoop as low as the perpetrators of such futile violence. For all the horror, this has been inspiring and reminds me that for all the tragedy in this world those words from the Lord's Prayer have a real meaning

## Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

We long, for it be on earth as we imagine it is in heaven, and just sometimes it is – and often ironically, it is when something least like God's Kingdom happens, that something most like God's Kingdom happens in response.

So let us thank God for all those unremarkable but extraordinary people who have brought the Kingdom of God into these dreadful situations, and let us continue to hold in our prayers all the emergency services, medics, intelligence services and volunteers who still have much work to do behind the scenes. Let our anger at the manifest abdication of responsibilities and failures in relation to the Grenfell Tower be directed towards ensuring that there is no repeat of the Hillsborough cover-up.

Let us hold in our prayers too, all those tragically bereaved families for whom the loss will never go away, even when these events become a distant memory for the rest of us. Let us continue to pray for them.

## Saint of the Month - by Kex Dean



# Ignatius of Loyola, Founder of the Society of Jesus, died 31st July 1556.

The youngest son of a Basque nobleman, Ignatius was born at his family's ancestral castle at Loyola in north-east of Spain. He served as a page at the court of King Ferdinand V of Castile, and later entered military service, being seriously wounded at the French siege of Pamplona in 1521. During his

lengthy convalescence, (his leg never properly healed and he was left with a permanent limp), he read the life of Christ and biographies of various saints. The result was that he resolved to devote himself to the spiritual life. He went on pilgrimage to Montserrat (near Barcelona), where he hung up his sword over the altar and exchanged clothes with a beggar. He then spent about a year at nearby Manresa, first working in a hospital there, then living as a hermit in a cave. He studied Thomas a' Kempis, *'The Imitation of Christ.'* It was probably during this year that he wrote the Spiritual Exercises, a manual of Christian prayer and meditation which has subsequently been used and valued (and is still used today) by Christians of many denominations and traditions.

After a pilgrimage to Rome and Jerusalem, he returned to Spain in 1524 and studied at the universities of Barcelona, Alcala and Salamanca, (where he fell foul of the Inquisition because of his unauthorized preaching). He went on to Paris to continue his studies and it was there in 1534 that Ignatius and a group of six students (including Francis Xavier), vowed to go as missionaries to Islamic Palestine. In 1537 the group, now ten in number, finding that war prevented them travelling beyond Venice, offered their services to the Pope. By 1540 they had been ordained and with papal approval formed the Society of Jesus, with a vow of personal obedience to the Pope in addition to the traditional three monastic vows. Ignatius was elected the first General of the order and in the remaining 15 years of his life saw the order grow a hundred-fold and to be in the vanguard of both the Counter Reformation and the missionary work of the Roman Catholic Church.

This prayer has become treasured by Christians of all traditions:

Teach us, good Lord, to serve you as you deserve To give and not to count the cost To fight and not to heed the wounds, To toil and not to seek for rest To labour and not to ask for any reward, Save that of knowing that we do your will Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

## The Quinquennial Report - by Nigel Beverley Stone

For those of us, who like me, did not know what a quinquennial report was, it is a five yearly inspection and record of how we are caring for our church. Finding an experienced, enthusiastic and highly qualified conservation architect is not an easy job but eventually one came to us, and over a cup of tea one Saturday morning, the Fabric committee knew that Peter Slinger was our man.

Peter agreed to conduct our report and with the aid of another colleague this was completed in one day on 24th April. That was the nail biting time, would he find problems that we were unaware of?

After a short delay we received his excellent and comprehensive report which gives us much written and photographic information on which to base our maintenance and repair activities for the next five years.

Other than some questions that we need to answer about water drainage and a recommendation for some further investigation on some of the tower stonework we found we were pretty much up to date with the other ongoing items. We are actively combining some of his suggestions with work that was already planned and we hope to have this work completed during this summer.

Subject to confirmation of support from the Mary Bass Trust, to whom we have recently made a submission for assistance, we hope to be able to complete work to replace the upper tower door, to carry out work to clean and protect the roof and guttering which includes vital work to clear several years worth of pigeon nesting material, debris and leaves from the many gulleys and drainage channels and also to install a new roof alarm system. If we achieve all these jobs this summer it will have been a wonderful start to the year for the new PCC and our church.

The Fabric committee has invited Peter to our next PCC meeting on 18th July, we will happily share the information we receive from him and together we can then all discuss the work that we will carry out during the next five years. If there are any jobs that you feel we may need to tackle please speak to Margaret or myself or any other member of the Fabric committee, Mick Boylan, Shep Shepherd and Carol Hellen. We will welcome your interest and any offers of help in whatever way possible will be appreciated.

## Vicars footnote

Our church has been wonderfully looked after over the years by generations of wardens and parishioners to whom we owe a great debt of gratitude. However this work has to be kept up and, as our treasurer has pointed out recently, we have spent very little on repair and maintenance over the last few years. The work on the drainage and guttering is now very urgent, as it is now resulting in water ingress which is damaging the organ and the stonework of the church. Equally vital is the requirement to install a roof alarm as part of a number of necessary antitheft initiatives.

I am hugely grateful to those who have agreed to form a new fabric committee to oversee and progress this work. Alongside that is the ongoing project of updating our inventory in order to take account of new additions to the church, the disposal of unwanted items and the relocation of items.

There are also plans to clear the drains at ground level and to clear a meter of ground all round the church in order to prevent week growth and leaf build up over the course of the year.

Those of you who have fond memories of the work of the *Tuesday Gang* - talk to David Arnold if you have never heard of them, will be interested to know that we intend to set up a *Saturday Gang* who will undertake both external and internal DIY work once a month on a Saturday morning. Anyone can join and you may be involved with dusting, painting, or leaf clearing depending on your interest or ability. Please see the advert below and come along if and when you can:

## 2017 Planned giving Campaign

As you know we launched our Planned giving Campaign 5 on 29th January with a sermon on the miracle at the wedding at Cana and with a lot of lovely cake!

There was then a bit of a pause while all the materials were prepared by the Finance and Stewardship



Committee but eventually we got it all out, funded in part by the Mary Bass Trust and by Easter most of the responses had been returned.

We are very grateful to all of you who took your time to think and pray about your giving and the net result was that 14 people increased their giving and four new people joined the planned giving scheme for the first time. This will result in us raising an extra £5,775 per annum. Not quite our target of £10,000 but very encouraging none the less.

There have also been a number of one-off donations, amounting to £4000 (if we include moneys from Lauren & Shep's cycle ride) which, though they are not planned giving, will most certainly help swell our income for 2017 for which we are hugely grateful.

If at any point any of you would like to review your giving further - either up or down depending on your circumstances - then please contact Glyn directly or complete another set of the forms which are available at the back of church.

If you never quite got round to reviewing your giving when the appeal was sent out it is still not too late and Glyn is happy to process the information at any time of the year. Please do note though, that if you plan on giving directly from your bank on a monthly basis, he will need a couple of months' notice in order to set up the arrangement.

During the course of this year the Finance and Stewardship committee intend to review our investment policy in the hope that we can maximise our investment income and so reduce our shortfall and we hope that the PCC will continue to be wise stewards of all the money that is entrusted to us.
