Letter from the Bishop of Grantham



Dear
Friends,
The words
'How can this
be?' seem
to me to be
hovering in
the air a great
deal at the
moment.

'How can this be' that we are

so close to the date of leaving the EU and we don't know precisely what is happening yet? 'How can this be' that I've paid my stamp all these years and all I hear about is hospitals and schools under huge stress? 'How can this be' that every year the trees seem to burst into bud a few days earlier than they did last year, but that many people cannot accept the evidence that says that this is as a result of human impact on the climate?

These and so many other versions of the question buzz around in my mind and heart – as do the very prosaic ones of human living that in different ways we each face – and in my case: 'How can this be' that my parents, who have been reasonably well physically to this point, suddenly seem now to be failing so rapidly?

'How can this be?'

These are big questions and real questions. They affect different parts of our lives. They require us to draw on deep sources of strength. They can depress us or energise us. They can encourage us to reach out to others for support, and they can also make us want to hide and to turn in on ourselves. And where is God in it all?

I don't underestimate the impact of these words and of their underlying and related questions.

However, as the words and questions gather, in the month of March at least I am comforted by the fact that as the 25th approaches, I can draw strength from the example of one amazing woman who has trodden the human path before us. The 25th of March is the Feast of the Annunciation, which is the day on which Mary was told the news that she would bear a child who would be Son of God—and not surprisingly, she exclaimed 'How can this be?' (Luke 1.34)

If Mary asked this question, then I think I am in good company if, on occasion, I ask it myself as well.

'How can this be?'

And once it had been explained to Mary that if she said 'yes', she was to enact God's will, then Mary did indeed summon her strength and courage and love and obedience, and having expressed her incredulity, proceeded to bring about God's purpose for her and for the world. She could have said 'no'. However, she said 'let it be so', and thus a new chapter opened in the life of God's creation.

Can I echo Mary's words? Can we?

Can we, having faced the questions, place our trust in God and respond with similar strength, courage, love and obedience? Can we draw strength from Mary's example?

It is my firm conviction that we can!

With every prayer and blessing, then, for March and for the Feast of the Annunciation,



Saint of the Month, by Kex Dean



March 18th, is the day we remember Cyril, Bishop of Jerusalem, Teacher of the Faith, 386. He was born in Jerusalem in 315 and ordained priest in 348. He was consecrated as Bishop of Jerusalem but his period as bishop was turbulent and difficult. Cyril tried to establish his diocese's freedom from the control of Caeserea, and as a consequence found himself out of favour with the Bishop of Caesarea, Acacius. He was exiled three times, in 357, 360 and 367. In total he spent 16 years of his 35 years as bishop in exile.

He was exiled because his theological beliefs clashed with those of Acacius and the lack of trust he showed in the ability of language to adequately convey doctrine.

Disagreements led to misunderstandings and mistrust between Acacius of Caesarea and Cyril and their

relationship was fraught with theological rivalry and tension, and Acacius was instrumental in the councils that sent Cyril into exile. Cyril was ultimately reinstated to full episcopal duties in 378, and took part in the Second Ecumenical Council at Constantinople in 381.

Cyril was a teacher, and was in charge of teaching those in preparation for baptism at Jerusalem. Indeed, it may have been his desire to communicate the Christian faith effectively and accurately that led him into doctrinal controversy. Cyril was seeking precision, in an age where diverse opinion was the norm.

Cyril was not only active in theological debate and teaching. He was known as a protector of the poor, who willingly sold church property and used the money gained to feed the poor. These actions were held against him on more than one occasion.

Many of Cyril's sermons and lectures have survived, and they reveal much about the life and teaching of the Early Church. He is remembered as a teacher of the Church, and as one who, although orthodox in thought, sought clarification of doctrine. He is an early example of those Christian leaders whose lot was often to be misunderstood because of the questions that he asked rather than the answers that he gave. An excerpt from one of his lectures illustrates his teaching skill and his drive for precision:

'And why did He call the grace of the Spirit, water. Because by water all things subsist; because water brings forth grass and living things; because the water of the showers comes down from heaven; because it comes down one in form, but works in many forms. Thus also the Holy Spirit, being one, and of one nature, and indivisible, divides to each His grace, according As He will, and as the dry tree, after partaking of water, puts forth shoots, so also the soul in sin, when it has been through repentance made worthy of the Holy Spirit, brings forth clusters of righteousness'.

On Good Morning Sunday this week, one of the listeners phoned in with Pope Francis' 10 things to fast from in Lent. Hurtful words, sadness, anger,

pessimism, worrying, complaining, feeling pressured, bitterness, selfishness, grudges, and words.

Instead he suggested we; use kind words, gratitude, patience, hope, trust in God, meditating, and prayerfulness, being filled with joy, being compassionate, being reconciled, and listening.

These remind me of the fruits of the Spirit; this form of fast will enable you to

grow these fruits and be closer to what God wants us to be.


I invite you to meditate on this poem I used at our Ash Wednesday Service.

Light as a feather God's finger caressed me With a sign of forgiveness Marked me with love.


Light as a feather Penitent, shriven, Signed with His life-mark, I go on my way.

Beautiful Brass Lectern



How many of you have noticed the lovely brass eagle lectern that is chained to the floor in the Lady Chapel and is thus unable to be used?

I found the following short article in a 1925 copy of Holbeach Parish News – which was kindly lent to me by Lynne Barkes.

A beautiful brass lectern for use at the side altar has been kindly presented to the Church by Mrs Bradfield. The lectern was originally given by her to the English Church at Aix-la-Chapelle, in memory of her husband who died there February 23rd 1907. As a result of the War the ornaments of that Church were damaged or destroyed. The lectern was broken in three pieces, but Mrs Bradfield has had it repaired by the Birmingham Arts Guild, and it is now equal to new. The bible on the lectern is the kind gifts of one of our communicants, and we are exceedingly grateful to both donors for their generous presents.

I wonder if it would be appropriate to unchain it and put it back into use for our Wednesday morning Eucharists?

A Bookshop in Holbeach?

A small group of us are planning to open a second-hand community bookshop on Holbeach High Street. It will be overseen by a charity set up for the purposes and it will be run by volunteers. As well as providing good quality affordable books and other media, we hope it will provide space for local artists and schools to exhibit, be a place for story-time for small people, book clubs for slightly older people, and even perhaps poetry evenings for creative people!



It is planned to run the project for a trial period of between 18 months and 2 years in the first instance to see how sustainable our idea is. But we believe the shop will contribute positively to the mixed economy of our High Street and, as its reputation grows, draw other visitors to our town, benefitting Holbeach businesses.

Once the shop has established itself and a contingency fund has been established, it is intended that profits will be used to support good causes (which will be chosen democratically by volunteers working in the shop), with at least 70% supporting local need. A Book Shop run for and by the Community,

All Saints Church PCC has very bravely agreed to support this venture as part of its commitment to encourage the flourishing of the town, and the Academy has said they will help us to build shelves. We are currently viewing available properties, building up a start-up fund and collecting books. We have already been generously offered grants and donations amounting to £3250 towards this venture.

The founding trustees of the charity include Cllr Nick Worth, Brian Boardman, who has been a second-hand and antiquarian bookseller for 30 years and Charles Baker, a tourism specialist who over the last 20 years has work in many areas of the tourism sector including hotel management, tour operations and destination management. More recently Charles has, in a voluntary capacity, overseen the second hand bookshop in St Albans Cathedral before moving to Holbeach in July 2017. Also Kate Plant, who has some experience working with the voluntary and community sector, setting up a small charity, bidding for funds, recruiting volunteers and delivering training. Other trustees will be appointed as the need arises.




