Letter from the Bishop of Grantham



Dear Friends,
On 8th June
the RAF 100
baton relay
enters the
Diocese of
Lincoln by
crossing the
Humber
Bridge. During
the month
of June the

relay will visit Scampton, Coningsby, Cranwell, Digby, Waddington and Lincoln Cathedral. It will visit 27 Bomber Command airfields in the county and also the new International Bomber Command Centre and memorial.

The length of time that the relay will spend in Lincolnshire indicates how important the RAF has been and is to our county and region.

I am quite moved by the idea of the relay. It is to be run entirely by volunteers, all of whom have a connection to the RAF. This in itself will demonstrate how deeply the service has influenced the life and the landscape of Lincoln. Moreover, when I say 'run', actually the baton will also be carried for part of its journey on horseback, by boat and by parachute; ingenuity is to be involved. Finally, every baton carrier will have to complete their own challenge: they will be given just a start point and an end point for their leg, which means that they will have to work out the route for themselves as a piece of orienteering.

Here is a participative, collaborative event, which also draws on individual energy, courage and ingenuity, all with a shared purpose: to give thanks for the contribution of the RAF to the protection of the nation and the pursuit of peace, and to root that work in the soil of the past so that it may continue to flourish whatever the future might bring.

Society depends upon participation, collaboration and individual effort. In every

generation, people have to pick up the baton of the past and carry it through the present into the future.

It is the same with faith: it is a great joy for the Christian to be given the flame of faith that has been tended by someone else, to allow that flame to burn in one's own life, and through one's life of faith perhaps to kindle new faith in others.

In greater Lincolnshire we stand on the shoulders of generations of people who have prayed to God, cared for their neighbours and shared the story of Jesus with those who would follow in their footsteps. The baton of faith — the flame of faith — has been carried with care and love, ingenuity and effort, since the first missionaries came to this part of England many centuries ago.

As during this month of June we may share in the RAF 100 relay, either as spectators or participants, I hope that what we witness in this event may also strengthen our life of faith, and encourage us as we each carry the baton and flame that every Christian was given when we were baptised.

My prayers are with those who serve in the RAF today, those who have served in the RAF in the past, and with all who worship and serve in our congregations and parishes – thank you – and may you take heart from these words in the Letter to the Hebrews:

'Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God'. (12:1–2, NRSV)

Saint for June, by Kex Dean



The Angel Gabriel appeared to Zechariah in the temple, standing by the alter of incense.

Elizabeth, the wife of Zechariah, brought forth a son; he grew and became strong in spirit.

The child born of Elizabeth is more than a prophet, for he will proclaim the way of the Lord.

JOHN THE BAPTIST d. c.30AD and his feast day is 24th June.

John came to proclaim the birth of Jesus Christ the Messiah.

All that we really know about John the Baptist comes from the Gospels.

He was, as it says above, the son of Zachariah, a Temple priest in Jerusalem, and his wife Elizabeth who was a cousin of the Blessed Virgin Mary. John was born when his mother was comparatively advanced in years, after the foretelling of his birth and the choice of his name by an angel. Nothing more is heard of him until he began his mission of preaching and baptizing in the river Jordan. His way of life and style of preaching closely resembled those of Old Testament prophets, his diet was locusts and wild honey, his message one of repentance and preparation for the coming of the Messiah and his Kingdom. Among his disciples were the future apostles Peter and Andrew. He himself baptized Christ and

recognized him as the Messiah when he saw the Spirit come down upon him as a dove. Later Christ praised him, saying that none among the sons of women had arisen who was greater than him.

John met his death after he denounced the incestuous union of Herod Antipas with his niece and brother's wife, Herodias, and was imprisoned for doing so and was beheaded at the request of Herodias's daughter Salome, as a gift for dancing at Herod Antipas's birthday.

John was believed to have been buried at Sebaste in Samaria, where he was honoured in the 4 century. The tomb was desecrated by Julian the Apostate. John's cult, however, is exceedingly ancient both in East and West, the Martyrology of Jerome, the Calendar of Carthage, and the sermons of Augustine all emphasize that his principal feast of lune is that of his earthly birthday, calculated from the Gospels as being six months before the birth of Christ [25 December] This led to a belief that he was sanctified in the womb and never committed sin. John has always been held in high repute by the Monastic Orders, because of his solitary and austere life in the desert, and he was considered to have been a monk himself. His intercession was believed to lead to the coming of Christ within the souls of the devout, just as his work in history has been to prepare the lews for his earthly coming.

Father, each year we recall the sad events of Good Friday and the joy of Easter Sunday, you give us this joyful season when we prepare to celebrate the paschal mystery with mind and heart renewed. You give us a spirit of loving reverence for you, our Father, and of willing service to our neighbour. As we recall the great events that gave us new life in Christ, you bring the image of your Son to perfection within us. Amen.

The Fabric Committee

Well can you believe it? Only a few issues ago we were keeping you up to date with 2017 and now here we are six months into 2018.

So it's about time we let you know what we think we can achieve in the Summer and Autumn months.

We now have approval to lay down a one meter cordon of plum slate pieces along the North and South sides of the church. This is important because it will help us to prevent weeds and saplings from growing up the church walls. We will start this job at the next meeting of the Saturday Gang on June 2nd, we hope that with enough helpers we can protect one side in one morning

We have found a new local contractor, J&S services, who will be cleaning the roof and gutters to make sure our roof drainage is good. Anyone who has been up the tower will know that this job is definitely not as easy as it sounds.

The long awaited improvements to the cremated remains area is our second Saturday Gang job.

We have one quotation in to straighten the bent railings along Church Walk and as soon as this is done our new maintenance man Matthew will start the painting. Where the Gang comes in is to carefully level the surface of the current cremation memorials and to clean the entire area. We would love anyone who has some time to spare to join with us to do this work. If you are unsure if you could help please ask Mick Boylan Margaret Whaley or myself.



When the five yearly inspection was carried out on the church last year, our architect Peter asked that we have our beautiful Ascension window (the West window) checked and repairs quoted for. We are fortunate that we have had this report now carried out by a Norwich based company of stained window specialists. Mick Boylan can let you know any details you require but we are currently awaiting their quotation and report for the work that is needed.

The repair of the window will require scaffolding, the windows being removed and taken to their workshops for repair. We have asked that they quote assuming the work takes place in 2019 this will give us chance to obtain permission from Lincoln and more importantly to start to raise part of the cost. It will be great to hear from anyone who has new ideas for fundraising.

Please let us know if there is a project which is important to you, it could be something that you are not sure if we can do, but we would like to try!

Holy Week was early on the calendar this year, and is undoubtedly the busiest time for our Church, reflecting the importance of this most special and Holy time. Taking part in the journey of Jesus to the Cross and his resurrection is fundamental to our faith and can be a life-changing experience.

There were Services every day during Holy Week, starting on Sunday 25th March with our Palm Sunday service. We had a beautiful sunny morning which added to the joy of the outdoor service and parade from the Library back to Church.



From Monday there was a Compline service every evening, with prayer and reflection using Faith Pictures in the 'One Friday' booklets to evoke Jesus journey to the cross. These were highly emotional evenings that touched and strengthened our faith.

The traditional Maundy Thursday Holy Communion Service was another highly emotional and reflective service with foot washing, stripping of the altar and followed by a vigil until midnight.



Good Friday morning we gathered at the Catholic Church, for the Churches Together Holbeach Walk of Witness. A large crowd set off at 12:00 pm carrying a sizable wooden Cross of Christ at the head of the procession, stopping at various points for readings, prayers and to sing hymns accompanied with live music performed by Kim, Neil and Denis. Hot Cross Buns and the excellent 'One Friday' booklets were handed out to passers-by as we moved through the town, arriving at All Saints Churchyard for the conclusion of the walk.



A very welcome and tasty homemade soup lunch was waiting for us in Church, particularly lovely to share this with our Churches Together visitors.

Soon after lunch, we held the Foot of the Cross, a sombre and reflective service with readings, hymns & prayers, during which the Cross is carried from the back of the Chuch to the Sanctuary with all the emotions that are imaginable for Jesus at that moment in time.

Saturday evening an Easter Eve Vigil took place. Followed by an Easter Dawn Service in the Vicarage garden at 6:00 am with everyone gathered to worship together and watch the sunrise at 6:35 am. The Paschal Candle and individual prayer candles were lit from the firepit as we prayed and celebrated Jesus resurrection, a joyous event on this most special day. Followed by a very welcome freshly cooked breakfast of free-range Vicarage eggs & bacon.



Just time to get home and back to All Saints for the Easter Day Holy Communion. The Church looked bright and full of flowers, which was in marked contrast to the previous few days.



An Easter garden, prepared by our schools was in the entrance porch, during the service the children rolled away the stone and lit the Easter candle. The service was filled with fabulous music from the choir including the juniors as well as a beautiful performance by Helen Verney of pie Jesu and Barry Lancaster excelling with a riff on 'He is Lord' on the organ.
