Letter from the Bishop of Lincoln

November was a time of remembrance. The Feast of All Saints, the Feast of All Souls, and we also remembered the end of the First World War.

There was not a single family in Britain, France and Germany unacquainted with grief; nor a corner of life unaffected. I was in Boston Stump for a festival of remembrance that included several exhibits about the impact of the war on the lives of the people of Boston.

For me the most graphic image was a street map of Boston in 1918 on which a black dot had been placed on each house where a family member had died in that conflict. Boston was much smaller then, but there was hardly a house without one or more dots – 200 in all.

Rather than people returning to a land fit for heroes, the soldiers who returned came home to unemployment and to a nation that did not show gratitude to those who fought for it. We have begun to learn this lesson.

War also led us to understand the nature of God in a different way.

During the war itself and in the decades that followed we uncovered something new in our understanding of God. Put simply: if God is loving and all-powerful, how could evil be allowed to flourish on this devastating scale? And why would we continue to trust in a God indifferent to our fate?

One person who wrestled with these questions was Geoffrey Studdert Kennedy. He was an army chaplain who earned the nickname Woodbine Willie for handing out cigarettes to the troops at the same time as copies of the New Testament. Woodbine Willie insisted on being on the front line with the troops whenever he could. Those battlefield experiences forced him to confront depths of evil and suffering which few of us will ever see.

Having entered the war with a secure faith in God and an abstract notion of evil, he ended it being absolutely certain of the existence of evil as a real force at work in the world. The challenge, then, was to find a way to reconcile all that he had seen in the trenches with the existence of a God who was worth believing in.

For Woodbine Willie, hope came with an understanding that God was no longer the almighty force of his pre-war understanding, able to prevent humans from harming one another if he so chose. Instead, God was present in the heat of battle, suffering along with humanity, in the intolerable conditions of the trenches, in the endless slaughter of young lives. God was characterised not by force and power, but by love; no longer remote from all that was going on, but intimately connected with it and suffering through it.

God has planted in each one of us the greatest potential for love; and yet, evil exists and because evil often expresses itself in violence it has to be confronted with force and violence, whether between nations or within a nation.

After the war, despite everything he had seen, Woodbine Willie was able to write, 'The universe is as an "unfinished movement" in which the underlying melody is love.'

The God we believe in brings love out of hate; light out of darkness; justice out of oppression; good out of evil; life out of death. This is our God, and his name is Love. Our acts of remembrance during November helped us to prepare for the season of advent as we remember the first coming of Christ and prepare for his second coming. To remember helps us to be mindful of what it means for Christ to be born in us today.

December 28. Holy Innocents.

The children of Bethlehem, two years old and under, who were massacred by Herod the Great. When he was told by the Magi of the birth of a new king, he tried in this way to eliminate all possible rivals [Matt. 2.1-18]. Commentators estimate the number slain, as about twenty-five. Their feast has been kept in the west from the 4th century; they were considered to be martyrs because they not only died for Christ, but instead of Christ. In the Martyrology of Jerome they are called 'the holy babes and sucklings', in the Calendar of Carthage, simply 'the infants'.

Poets such as Prudentius, preachers such as Augustine, and artists such as Masaccio developed both the theological and the human elements of the story. In honouring the Innocents, the Church honours all who die in a state of innocence and consoles parents of dead children with the conviction that these also will share the glory of the infant companions of the infant Jesus. Bede too wrote a hymn in their honour, in England their feast was called Childermas.

Richard Rolle of Hampole, Spritual Writer, 1349. Feast Day, 20th January.

Richard Rolle was born at Thornton-le-Dale in the North Riding of Yorkshire in 1305. The age in which he lived was one of change and worry with seemingly unfathomable reasons for the success or failure of many communities and businesses.

Richard started a degree at Oxford, but never completed it, choosing instead to live the solitary life, settling close to the Cistercian nuns at Hampole, his base for the rest of his life. It was here that he wrote his most famous works; The Mending of Life, probably in the 1320s and The Fire of Love, written about 1343,

Three themes dominated Richard's spiritualty. He challenged any equation of Christianity with power and wealth. He stressed the



journey of the self rather than that of the community, and he focused upon the suffering Christ. These themes turned upside down the prevailing attitude of the day towards the Christian life. Richard sought to encourage individuals to think of their personal journey towards God, rather than to see faith only as a communal activity. He stressed personal experience, and regarded his spiritual experience as a validation of his authority.

Richard saw no reason why an individual should not reach the highest level of spiritual life that can be attained on earth. He tried to communicate the incommunicable experience of God within himself to others. He produced some of the most passionate writings about prayer, but was so enwrapped in his own vision of God and quest for perfection that he was removed from those around him. As a consequence he struggled to apply the experience of God that he sought so vividly to his relationship with others, or to those within the Church whom he saw as defective or in error. His approach seems to be one so focused on heaven that earth is intolerable. However, his contribution both to mystic writings and to theology is undeniable, and his thirst for the tangible experience of the Holy Spirit cannot be doubted.

"O Holy Spirit, who breathes where you will, come into me and snatch me up to yourself. Fortify the nature you have created, with gifts so flowing with honey that, from intense joy in your sweetness, it may despise and reject all which is in this world, that it may accept [you giving them], spiritual gifts, and through melodious jubilation, it may entirely melt in Holy Love, reaching out for uncircumscribed Light."

South East Lincolnshire Joint Strategic Planning Committee

The South East Lincolnshire Local Plan was submitted to the Secretary of State in June 2017 for examination. The 'Examination in Public' commenced in October 2017 and was completed in April 2018.

The examination resulted in some changes being required to the plan and in response to the comments received to the consultation held in the summer we are consulting on further changes and an updated Sustainability Appraisal, Habitats Regulations Assessment and Equality Impact Assessment. Therefore, we will be undertaking a six week consultation on the 'Further Main Modifications' to the Plan from 30th November to 14th lanuary 2019.

Comments can only be made on the changes to the plan and, like the previous consultation, must focus on whether they make the Local Plan 'sound' and compliant with legal and procedural requirements. As a consequence there will not be any public exhibitions at village halls
