#### The Power of Prayer

In May 1940 the Second World War looked soon to be lost by the Allies. Our troops were trapped between the sea at Dunkirk and the advancing Nazi army, and mass slaughter seemed inevitable.

On 23rd May the despairing King George VI broadcast a national call to prayer, and the nation responded: you can still see grainy black and white photos of queues of people on Sunday, 26th May outside cathedrals, churches and chapels, gathering to pray for a miracle.

A flotilla of boats set sail in the hope that 30,000 people, around 10% of the forces, might be rescued. Storms came out of nowhere and battered Europe so violently that the Luftwaffe were unable to take off. Meanwhile, in a decision which his generals at the time violently opposed, Hitler had ordered his advancing ground forces to halt. The English Channel later became as calm as a millpond, in spite of the nearby storms, with the boats carrying a total of 338,000 men to safety: British, French, Belgian, Dutch and Polish.

Coincidence? Or a dramatic answer to a nation's prayers? Churchill and the King obviously thought the latter, as a national day of thanksgiving was called, two weeks after the day of prayer, to give thanks to God for what Churchill called 'The Miracle of Dunkirk'.

In the Church today we have become very used to the idea that prayer is where we align our wills to that of God, that we change, rather than our circumstances. There is truth in this, but the other side is that the Bible and history are full of examples of God changing situations, not just people.

Our diocese needs the fuel of prayer if we really are to see lives transformed. We need the kind of desperate, expectant, faith which sees God actually doing things in our world. One way in which that is happening in our diocese is through our own praying community, the Community of St Hugh, which is to be formally launched on Saturday, 28th September. But wherever we are, let's cry out to God to make a difference, not just in our lives, but in the lives of those for whom we pray.

#### FORTY MARTYRS OF ENGLAND AND WALES. Feast 25, October.

A group of representative English and Welsh Roman Catholics who were martyred between 1535 and 1679; they were selected from 200 already beatified by earlier popes. The forty were canonized by Paul VI on 25 October 1970. Thirteen were seminary priests, ten were Jesuits, three Benedictine, and three Carthusian monks, one Brigettine, two Franciscans, and one Austin Friar; the remaining seven were lay folk, four men and three women.

Their remembrance and use for intercessions was spontaneous and contemporary: it is exemplified by a famous series of paintings in the English College, Rome, by Circiniani. This series included, by express papal permission, martyrs of England from 1535 to 1583, who were accorded the same veneration as that given to earlier martyrs such as Alban, Boniface, Edmund, and Thomas of Canterbury. The forty include those who were executed for refusing to take the Oath of Supremacy, or simply for being priests or because they harboured priests.

Lord we as Christians remember your dignity! As we became a partner in God's nature, we refuse to return to

the old, wicked behaviour, we remember the head and the body which we are members of, we remember that we were rescued from the power of darkness through baptism and brought into your light and kingdom.

# ANDREW, APOSTLE AND MARTYR.


Feast Day 30, November.

Andrew was the brother of Simon Peter. He was a fisherman by trade, his home was at Carpernaum. He was a disciple of John the Baptist before becoming an apostle of Christ. In all the Gospel lists of apostles his name is among the first four; he is specially mentioned for introducing Peter to Jesus, his share in the feeding of the 5,000 and with Phillip when some Greeks wanted to meet Jesus.

It is not certain where he preached the Gospel, where he died or (even in Chrysostom's time) where he was buried. The most ancient written tradition links him with Greece: Scythia and Epirus both claimed him as their apostle, while Patras in Achaia claimed to be the place where he was crucified and preached to the people for two days before he died. An early medieval forgery attributed to him the founding of the Church of Constantinople. This claim was strengthened by the

translation of his supposed relics from Patras; it was intended to provide some counterweight to the more solid claim of Rome to possess the relics of Peter and Paul.

There was also a notable following in the West. His feast was universal from the 6th century; churches were dedicated to him from early times in Italy and France, as well as Anglo-Saxon England, where Hexham and Rochester were the earliest of 637 medieval dedications. Ancient legends include that of a journey to Ethiopia, preserved in the Old English poem 'Andreas' (once attributed to Cynewulf) and even more influential, that of a translation of his relics from Patras to Scotland, A church was built in Fife now called St. Andrews which became a centre for evangelization and eventually pilgrimage. This story, which survives in several irreconcilable forms. some of which suggest angelic intervention, is the reason for the choice of Andrew as patron of Scotland. (Andrew is also patron of Russia).

# "Helle" from Sally Clifton

#### Hi to all the residents of Holbeach and the worshipping community at All Saints.

My name is Sally Clifton, feel free to call me Sall. I live just down the road in Sutton St James with my daughter Kirsty and our dog Bertie. Kirsty and I moved to the village on Friday 13th December 2002. It was pouring with rain that day, something the weather continued to do incessantly until the 30th January 2003 when the snow came – ooh for about a fortnight! At that time, I had 3 dogs that needed to be walked at least three miles a day, each, every day, and a baby in a pushchair. Kirsty was exactly I year, I month and I day old when we moved in. I wandered the wet lanes for several hours every day, walking my dogs and pushing Kirsty's all-terrain buggy (with baby), wondering why on earth God called me to this place. Then the sun came out and I fell in love with the fens. People came out of their houses (and hibernation) and talked to me. I love listening to people's stories so, in the months following, I learned a lot about village life and history.

After being widowed in 2010 I became churchwarden at St James and began to explore my vocation. As I was newly widowed it was decided that, for the time being, I should study to become a Reader. I was duly licensed in Lincoln Cathedral on my 51st birthday in 2014. I sent out emails to all my friends containing



pictures of me with Bishop Christopher under the heading look who came to my party!' Since then I have continued to study. I gained a degree in Theology. Ministry and Mission and the went on to study for an MA - I am in my final year. I love to learn; it helps me make sense of the Bible and I hope that I am able to help others to do the same. God's Holy scriptures still challenge me and the more I study, the more I realise how little I really know! I will enjoy hearing what your understanding is - you have plenty to teach me and I look forward to listening to what you have to say. My daughter Kirsty is in her final year at Spalding High School where she is studying RE with Philosophy and Ethics, Business, and English Language. We have very challenging conversations on all sorts of subjects and I am daily reminded of how much I still have to learn about life!

In my first summer in Sutton St James, out on one of my dog walks, I stopped to talk to an elderly gentleman who was waiting for the call connect bus to take

him to Long Sutton. There, he told me, he would pick up the bus to the big city. I remarked that Peterborough was such a long way for a bus journey. He looked at me, a bit odd like...

'I'm going to Holbeach,' he said. As he was in his late 90's and could remember the village before it had mains electricity and a proper metalled road to the village, I began to understand why Holbeach felt like a big city to him. So, when I tell you that I have transferred my ministry from Sutton St. James to All Saints in order to experience big city ministry you understand why I say this; I am not laughing at Holbeach, I promise.

So, as I continue to explore my vocation for the priesthood, and explore Holbeach (sans baby and dogs) I hope to meet you and listen to your stories. Although I don't need to know you in order to serve you, I want to know you so that I can serve you well.

### Organ Restoration

The organ restoration is well underway and so far, all is going to plan. The chancel is screened off, so here are a few pictures of the work hidden away from view.

Scaffolding has been erected and the choir organ dismantled. The board held by Malcolm Spinks, the organ builder, is covered in solenoids. There are 400 in total on several boards and all bar a few of them are stuck solid. The blower box has been removed and sealed with duct tape ready to go and have all the asbestos removed from it. The work will continue until mid-November.


