

Thy Kingdom Come is a global prayer movement that invites Christians around the world to pray from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus.

Since its start in May 2016, just four years ago, God has grown Thy Kingdom Come from a dream of possibility into a movement. In 2019 Christians from 172 countries took part in praying 'Come Holy Spirit', so that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to faith in Jesus Christ.

This praying together has been across our diversity and differences as every person, household and church are encouraged to pray in their own way. Whilst an astonishing 92% of people said they were praying for

family and friends to come to faith in Jesus, and 40% of those taking part in 2019 did so for the first time, we recognise there is much more we can do together to help Thy Kingdom Come be fully in the lifeblood of the Church.

During the 11 days of Thy Kingdom Come, it is hoped that everyone who takes part will:

- Deepen their own relationship with Jesus Christ
- Pray for 5 friends or family to come to faith in Jesus
- Pray for the empowerment of the Spirit that we would be effective in our witness

Reflection by Rosamund

Psalm 121

- I. I lift up my eyes to the hills; from where is my help to come?
- 2. My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth.
- He will not suffer your foot to stumble; he who watches over you will not sleep.
- 4. Behold, he who keeps watch over Israel shall neither slumber nor sleep
- The Lord himself watches over you; The Lord is your shade at your right hand,
- So that the sun shall not strike you by day, neither the moon by night.
- 7. The Lord shall keep you from all evil; it is he who shall keep your soul.
- 8. The Lord shall keep watch over your going out and your coming in, from this time forth for evermore.

As most of you will know we have been preaching on the psalms during Lent. They are turning out to be an extraordinarily prescient set of psalms for the times we are now in.

Psalm 121 was the one set for 8th March.

For the psalmist the enemy would come over the hills and would not be seen until they had reached the peak of the hill. Today we feel surrounded by an unknown enemy, we are afraid of what will appear over the hills at any time, we don't really know what contingency plans to put in place or quite how to live with them when we have put them in place.

The psalmist reminds himself and us all that our help comes from the Lord. The Lord watches over us both night and day and will keep us from evil. Whatever happens God will be there at both our coming in and our going out. Whether we live or die, God will be with us, and all we can do is simply trust in that.

Advice has changed on a day to day basis and now we have been told that churches can no longer hold public worship. This is a great blow to our way of life as Christians but please let me assure you that Morning Prayer will continue to be said every weekday morning and communion offered each Sunday on your behalf. We hope to be able to work out how to record worship for you to take part in via the website over the next week or so. But of course we are called to live out our lives as Christians in so many other ways than just in worship and I hope

that we can support each other and the wider community through this crisis.


I have divvied out the contact details of everyone on the Electoral Roll between members of the Ministry Team and hopefully someone will be able to keep in touch regularly during this difficult time.

APOLLONIUS. (d. 183) Roman martyr. Saints Day 28th April.

Apollonius was a Roman senator who was denounced as a Christian to the authorities by his own slave; he made an impressive verbal and written apologia to the senate. This comprised a criticism of paganism as futile because its idols are human artefacts without life, autonomy, reason, or virtue: hence they should be rejected. Christianity is superior because of its concepts of death and life: death is a natural necessity which has nothing frightening about it, while the true life is the life of the soul. Above all, Christianity surpasses paganism through the work of Christ, the revealing Word of God and teacher of moral life, who became man to destroy sin by his death. This last, predicted both by Scripture and by Plato, can be compared to the death of the prophets and of Socrates. He was mention by Jerome and Eusebius; his name is in early liturgical books; more light has been shed on him by the discovery of Acts in Greek and Armenian.

It seems certain that Apollonius was beheaded on the 21 April; his feast was kept in the Martyrology, book of martyrs, of Jerome on the 18 of April, but at Constantinople on the 23 of July.



THE ODOSIUS OF KIEV (Of the Caves) (c.1002-74), Abbot.

Theodosius was born at Vasil`evo (near Kiev) of a wealthy family in the service of the prince, he passed most of his early life at Koursk. When still very young, he unsuccessfully attempted a

pilgrimage to the Holy Land. His father died when he was thirteen. but his dominating mother `of muscular build with a voice like a man' tried hard to retain him in lay life and made a scene with the abbot when he became a monk. Theodosius fled to Kiev. taking refuge with the hermit Antony in a cave above the Dnieper. Here he received the tonsure and was ordained priest.

In 1062 he founded a monastery and built a church. He became abbot of the Caves monastery in 1063 and adopted the rule of Theodore the Studite. His monasticism was marked neither by Palestinian excess of mortification nor Byzantine political activism but resembled rather the ideals of Basil. He stressed the importance of community life and charity to all, first to other monks but also to guests,

the sick, prisoners (to whom he sent a cartload of food each week), and anyone of whatever class who sought spiritual counsel. Each monk had to study Scripture and as well as practising exemplary poverty. Always accessible to all, he would perform tasks distasteful to young monks such as the personal care for two years of an old monk almost completely



paralysed. Theodosius who was the archetypal spiritual father, dwelt in by God and so able to bring light and comfort to all. He said, `Christ sought us out, found us, carried us on his shoulders and set us at the Father`s right hand... It was not we who sought him, but he who sought us`. He died at Eastertide and was buried in one of the original caves. His monastery is still a place of pilgrimage, and in 1108 he was canonized by the Bishops of the province of Kiev.

'WE BELIEVE IN THE RESURRECTION...'

When Christians gather together each week and proclaim their belief in the resurrection of the body, what exactly do we mean?

In the Bible, St Paul devotes a whole chapter to questions like this, and he includes this incredible statement:

If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ - whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

(I Corinthians I5.I3-I9; NRSV)

He goes on to make it extremely clear that what he is talking about is indeed a physical, bodily resurrection – we will be given new bodies, similar to but different from our earthly bodies. It is not, as the mistaken vestry prayer says, the 'souls of the faithful departed' which will 'rise in glory'. It is their bodies!

But the resurrection is a spiritual reality as well as a physical one. The idea of resurrection tells us that whatever the circumstances, however low things might get, there is nothing that God is unable to change. Even death itself could not hold Jesus, and there are no circumstances in our lives which are beyond his reach and beyond his redemption.

So, for what resurrection are you hoping and praying this Easter-time? Where in your life and circumstances are you looking for God's new life? Paul ends his chapter with this triumphant cry:

"Death has been swallowed up in victory."


"Where, O death, is your victory?"
Where, O death, is your sting?"

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks

be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.





List Of Jobs For The Saturday Gang 2020

Holbeach All Saints Ladies Group met on Thursday 20th February 2020. Members and two visitors were welcomed by Sharon Cole.


