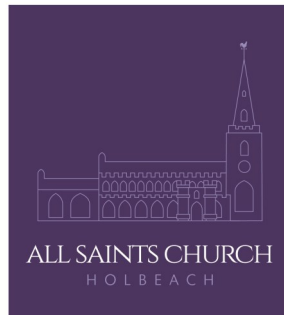


Harvest in Holbeach

Holbeach in Harvest Show Participation Terms

1. Entries are welcome from anyone from the Holbeach and surrounding area.
2. One Entry per person per class.
3. All exhibits should be homemade by the submitting exhibitor.
4. We can not accept any new entries after 11am on the day of the show and each entry must be staged by then.
Although we may be able in exceptional circumstance accept entries the night before.
5. Entry fees are 50p per adult and 20p for children under 15, to be paid when submitted.
6. Judging will take place by 2pm at which time certificates will be allocated for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places with Trophies for overall winner in both Adult and Children sections.
7. Exhibits must remain in place until at least 4:30pm . Any entries not collected by the end of the day will be disposed of appropriately. Any food items will be donated to the local Food Bank for use or distribution.
8. All Exhibitors must supply their own containers, vases, plates etc.
9. All Saints can not accept responsibility for any loss or damage that may occur to exhibits or containers.
10. The Judge's decision is final and we would like to take this opportunity to thank all Judges for their deliberations and time.

Fruit and Vegetables

Ideally in good, fresh condition and should be typical of the species, uniform in colour, size and form. Each should be clean (washed only), healthy and undamaged, and may be cut/sliced for judging

- A1 Runner Beans (6), cut with stalk attached , no sign of seeds.
- A2 Tomatoes (5 standard size) with stem attached
- A3 Tomatoes (5 Cherry size) with stem attached
- A4 Cucumber with stalk attached and may be part sliced for judging.
- A5 Courgettes (2)
- A6 Potatoes (3) same variety,
- A7 Carrots (3) with tops
- A8 Beetroot (3) with tops
- A9 Onions (3) tying or whipping of tops optional and should not be over skinned.
- A10 Herbs (tied bunch may be mixed) could be for medicinal or cooking.
- A11 Apples (3) same variety,
- A12 Pears (3) same variety,

Flowers

Ideally in good, fresh condition and should be typical of the species or cultivar, uniform in colour, size, age and form. Each should be home grown, clean , healthy, pest free and undamaged.

- B 1 Vase of single variety (min 3 stems)
- B2 Vase of mixed flowers (min 3 varieties)
- B3 Vase of Dried Flowers / Grasses (min 3 stems)
- B4 Single stem (Rose, Lily)
- B5 Flowers in a Teacup

Homemade: Cakes, Bread, Preserves and Beverages.

Ideally in good, fresh condition and should be homemade from ‘scratch’ including wine. May be cut, sliced or tasted for judging.

- C1 Cupcakes (3) presented on a side plate,
- C2 Fruit Scone (3) presented on a side plate,
- C3 Savoury Scone (3) presented on a side plate,
- C4 Victoria Sponge (3 egg recipe) preserve only filling,
- C5 Homemade Bread (any type) please specify if bread machine used.
- C6 Homemade Jam (labelled, dated and type)
- C7 Homemade Chutney (labelled, dated and type)
- C8 Homemade Marmalade or Curd (labelled, dated and type)
- C9 Homemade Red Wine (labelled, dated and type)
- C10 Homemade White / Rose wine (labelled, dated and type)
- C11 Home—Flavoured Spirit (labelled, dated and type)
- C12 Eggs (3 same breed) May be broken to test freshness,
